She explained that she hadn't been able to bring herself to dance or listen to music in over a year since her son's death because music and dancing was a painful reminder. While we were in different breakout sessions, Ros met up with the two other women. Out of the over 600 women in attendance, another woman came into their path and said I have an extra ticket to the fundraiser would any of you want it. The two women looked at Ros and said, "this is your opportunity".

Ros then accepted and was my date for the fundraiser. As we entered the dance, they gave us leis as part of the festivities. For the first time in a year, Ros danced and listened to music.

As she expressed how good she felt to laugh and dance, she mentioned that she also wasn't able to wear red (her son's favorite color). I grinned as I pointed to the lei around her neck. In that moment, she noticed that her lei was red.

Ros now works for the Clear Cause Foundation. The Clear Cause Foundation's whose purpose it is to reach out to 45 million American youth and students who are encouraged to study abroad every year with comprehensive stay-safe information, emergency preparedness, and safety assessments.
